








Badger scat is big and slimy (as they eat a lot of worms)! They are smelly and have lots of bits in them. Badgers dig a pit to poo in called a latrine close to their sett.



Hedgehog droppings are shaped a bit like a fox poo with a point at the end, but they are thinner and smaller and with bits of shiny beetles and berry seeds in them.



Otters live by water and love to eat fish. You can see the fish scales and bones sticking out of their poo which is called spraint. Their spraint is not very big and a bit of a splat, but you can find it on rocks by the water's edge and under bridges.

Did you know?

You and I are mammals!

Mammals are animals with

warm blood, hair and most

give birth to live babies

(we don't lay eggs)!



Bats only eat insects so their droppings are small and dry.
They might look a bit like mouse droppings, but if you put one in a tissue and roll it between your fingers it will crumble easily (mouse droppings roll like play dough)!

Did you know?

Otter spraint smells like jasmine tea (nothing else smells like that)!
